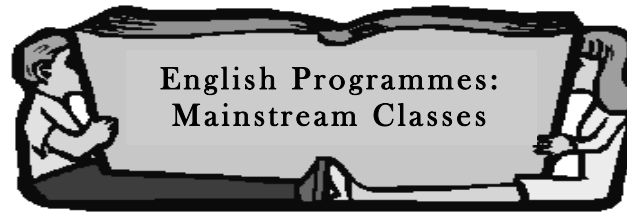

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Comprising approximately one-third of the total pupil population, the increased numbers of EAL pupils ... has challenged schools in Ireland to adapt their practices and policies...and to respond to the needs of a culturally and linguistically diverse school community (DES, 2012; 2019).

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A number of hybrid, interactive online/concrete-based English programmes are available for schools to use in addition to teacher-made resources, big books, concrete materials, games, downloaded resources and online applications. The sample programmes below incorporate **differentiated content and methodologies for teaching all children, including EAL learners in whole class and small group settings.** Try to align *Primary Language Curriculum (2019) outcomes, inclusive methodologies/learning experiences and assessment* to chosen programme content, differentiated activities and teacher-made resources.

- * An interactive, thematic programme, including teacher guides, schemes and lesson ideas that are **curriculum-aligned** and integrate across strands. There are print and digital aspects; non-fiction texts include photos from places in Ireland; interactive songs, extension literature and cross-curricular links, songs, play-based opportunities and games.
- * **Lesson plans for shared readers include ideas for beginning EAL learners.**

- * An interactive, integrated, thematic English programme—Emma and her best friend, Luke, enjoy magical adventures in their Irish town and include familiar settings such as the local GAA club and a trip to the farm. It includes core readers, skills books and teacher's resource book.
- * There are interactive posters, dialogues; games; animations and slideshows; songs, poems and lesson plans. **Differentiation of topic-specific language could support linguistic diversity.**

- * Project-based books are printable in small booklet format and could be used with Literacy Lift Off groups as well as a potential way to involve parents. *'This could be a good alternative to using PM books and you can download books in other languages.'* (Teacher X, 2018 *Embracing Diversity, Nurturing Integration, Literacy for Life Project (EDNIP Summer Course).*

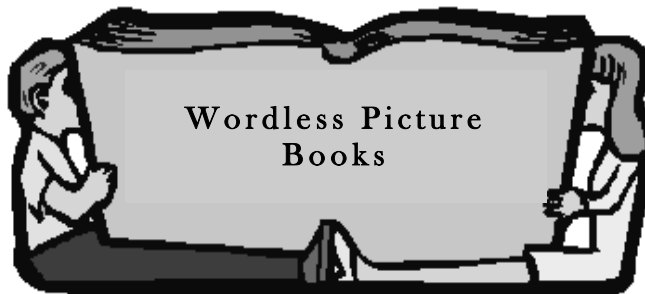

Because there are no language hurdles in wordless picture books, and with the aid of focused activities, they can help EAL learners of varying language levels interpret meaning and storyline from pictures, build on their confidence in and enjoyment of reading in a second language as well as use storytelling as the basis for reading and writing, building up their receptive and expressive language e.g. narrating, questioning, problem-solving/persuasive language. International Board on Books for Young People (IBBY) Europe highlights books in the most common languages currently spoken by migrant or refugee children in Europe. IBBY hosts the International Children's Book Day each year and the European Regional conference at the Bologna Children's Book Fair.

Children in your class can visit the IBBY website and suggest books for others to read in their home languages. Talking about and reading books in children's L1 can aid cross-lingual transfer of skills in the L2 as well as develop awareness of 'cognates'/language awareness of similarities and differences between languages for all learners e.g. 'cóta' in Irish, 'coat' in English.

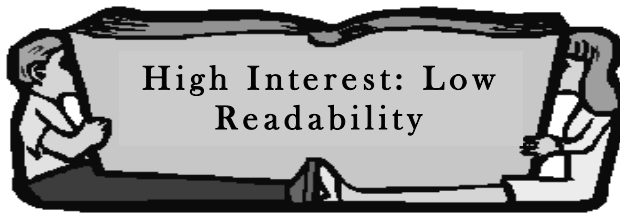

Fact files and topical fictional stories in the upper levels aim to motivate older children.

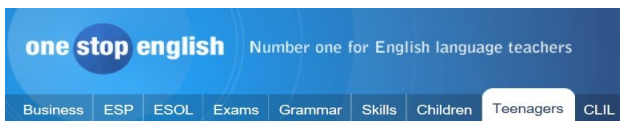
